Band Camps

Symphonic Band Camp (Aka Music Camp)

Description: The CWU Symphonic Band Camp, conducted by Professor Mark Lane, has one of the best teacher/student ratios of any band camp in the Northwest. The staff for the camp includes CWU faculty, as well as some of the premiere high school instructors and professional musicians in the state. Learn music theory and participate in master classes, music sectionals, and small ensembles.

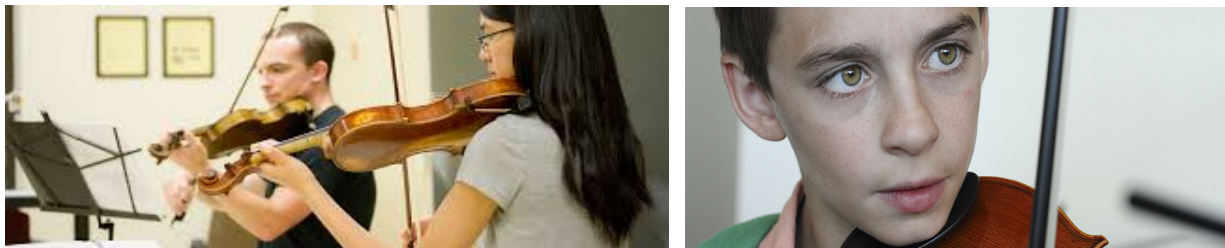
